

Senator Kirsten Gillibrand passed the historic *James Zadroga 9/11 Health and Compensation Act*, which created the World Trade Center Health Program and the September 11th Victim Compensation Fund to ensure survivors and first responders get the health care and benefits they deserve. She has continued to fight to ensure both programs are fully funded. And every year, her office helps New Yorkers get the benefits they were promised.

If you are a 9/11 first responder or survivor who needs assistance with the WTC Health Program or the Victim Compensation Fund, Kirsten and her team are here to help.

In order to qualify for compensation or to be certified for health coverage, survivors and first responders must provide documentation that they were at the WTC site or another qualifying area for a certain amount of time.
